RULES AND REGULATIONS

General Rules

1. It is the responsibility of the show/event committee, or organizers and the facility owners and managers to ensure that all BC Health Authority, Safesport and WorkSafeBC directives are followed and enforced. Horse Council is not a regulatory body and it is understood and agreed that sanctioning and approval of either a HCBC Provincial circuit event or Equestrian Canada Bronze or Silver competition relates to the use of the rule book and approved officials only.
2. This Competition is a Horse Council BC provincially sanctioned Competition and will be governed in accordance with the Horse Council BC Rule Book. Knowledge of the Rules is the responsibility of the Competitor. The Horse Council BC Rule Book, will be used and can be found at the following link: <http://www.hcbc.ca/Competition-Documents.html> General Rules
3. Classes specifically for riders with disabilities (designated as Para) are covered by the rules and specifications of the current PE and HCBC rulebook and will be conducted accordingly. At the discretion of their therapeutic instructor, Para riders are permitted to use their regular tack and are not subject to HCBC or PE tack check rules.
4. Neither Horse Council BC, its Board of Directors, North Fraser Therapeutic Riding Association Board of Directors, organizing committee, staff, volunteers, officials, or employees of this horse show nor the Maple Ridge Equi-sport Centre, will be responsible in any way, for damage, injury, or loss to persons, horses or property of exhibitors, spectators, owners, riders, trainers, or grooms. All competitors must be members of Horse Council BC to participate.
5. **ALL competitors must have a current Horse Council B.C. membership.**
Photocopies must be submitted with your entry form. * If the horse owner is not the competitor and will be on site working with the horse in any capacity they must also submit a copy of their horse council membership
6. Riders may enter up to three tests per day per horse.
7. **DRESSAGE TESTS:** Current EC Tests will be used in Dressage classes. Either FEI PE tests or the EC Para-Dressage tests may be used in the Para-Dressage classes. Horse Council BC tests will be used in the Western Dressage classes. Competitors must provide their own commanders and callers as required.
8. The Management reserves the right to split, combine, cancel, and/or adjust any class at its discretion, to govern all conditions of the show, and to make decision upon any matters not covered by current HCBC or PE rules.
9. **SPECIAL REQUESTS AND MULTIPLE ENTRIES:** Please indicate on the entry form, the order in which you wish to ride if you have multiple horses/tests in the same class. Special requests cannot be considered after the closing date of entries. Once assigned, ride order will not be changed.
10. **Hors Concur:** Hors Concours entries must pay the same entry fee as regular entries (unless otherwise stated in the prize list) and are subject to the same conditions and rules which apply to regular entries. Hors Concours entries are not eligible for prizes or awards
11. Any entry not properly completed or not including the required documentation or payments will be returned to the sender. No competition number will be issued without payment. ***Entries close on June 13th, or after the first 100 entries are received.***

PAYMENT: Cash or cheques can be dropped off at the NFTRA OFFICE at 12591 – 209th Street, Maple Ridge. Please make cheques payable to 'NFTRA' or e-transfer to: **Manager@nftra.ca.**

Stabling deposits must be included with entry fees.
Dishonored cheques will be subject to a \$45.00 penalty.

12. **REFUNDS:**

Cancellations received prior to event closing: Prior to the closing date of June 12th, all entry fees will be refunded except for the \$25 administration fee.

Cancellations received after June 12th, 50% of class fees will be refunded with a veterinarian/physician certificate. A veterinarian/physician certificate must be presented 24 hours PRIOR to the start of the show for any fees to be refunded. ***Stabling and administration fees will not be refunded.***

13. **LATE ENTRIES:** Entries submitted after June 12th will be accepted at the discretion of the Competition Manager based on scheduling, availability and subject to an additional **\$25.00 administration late fee**. Late entries will forfeit all funds or refunds in the event the rider may need to scratch. **No refunds will be given for late entries.**
14. **STABLING:** Stabling on the show grounds will be available from 12:00 noon Friday, June 19, 2026. The stabling fee is \$150.00 from noon Friday until completion of the show on Sunday and includes bedding. ***Stabling fees are non-refundable. A stable deposit of \$50.00 is required.*** Stalls must be stripped and cleaned before departing. The Barn Manager will review your stall at the end of the day to determine if your deposit is refundable or not. All other stall maintenance is the responsibility of the competitor. Shavings will be available as bedding. Stall charts will be posted in stabling area. Please note that stabling is assigned and any changes must be approved by the Competition Manager and Barn Manager.
15. **TACK STALLS:** Tack stalls are included for stabling competitors while supplies last. Tack stalls will be available for haul-in or walk-in competitors for \$50 if space is available.
16. **SCHOOLING HORSES** are permitted to attend competition grounds for schooling purposes for a fee of \$50 for the 2-day show. An entry form must be completed and a number assigned for all schooling horses by the Entry Closing Date. Stabling fees are applicable for all schooling horses.
17. **FARRIER:** The Farrier will be 'on call' for the duration of the show Liz Dube – 778-233-1965
18. **VETERINARIAN:** The veterinarian will be 'on call' for the duration of the show 778-896-5733
19. **FIRST AID:** First Aid will be provided on site for the duration of the show. Lori Smithers-Ruiz 778-996-7581
20. **SHOW OFFICE:** Rider numbers and packages can be picked up on Friday June 19th, from noon - 4:00 at the NFTRA office at 12591 209th Street, Maple Ridge. The show office, located in the Tower at the MREC will be open on Saturday June 20th and Sunday, June 21nd from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
21. **SCHOOLING AREAS:** Schooling in competition rings is permitted on Friday only.
22. **COMPETITION NUMBERS:** Must be worn and visible at all time in schooling and exercise areas as well as in the competition ring.
23. **HEAD GEAR:** Approved headgear is required for ***all participants***. Competitors must wear a properly fitted ASTM or BSI approved helmet with the safety harness correctly secured, at all times while mounted on the competition or event grounds. Competitors not meeting this requirement will not be allowed to compete.
24. Hors Concours may be allowed at this competition depending on how many entries are in the class.
25. Whips to a maximum length of 120cm may be carried for horses and 100cm for ponies.
26. Lunge whips are permitted only when lunging. Lunging is permitted in designated areas only.
27. Dogs must be leashed and under control at all times.

Entries:

1. **Entries close on Friday, June 12th, 2026 (or when 100 entries have been received) For late entry regulations please see #13 under Rules and Regulations.**
2. Ride times will be available by 1:00 pm on Thursday June 18, 2026 on our website www.nftra.ca and circulated via email from obs@nftra.ca
3. All competitors must sign the NFTRA waiver.
4. **ALL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE PHOTOCOPIES OF CURRENT HCBC MEMBERSHIPS FOR RIDERS.** Horse Owners HCBC photocopies only required if they will be on site handling the horse.

Freestyles:

1. Freestyle riders must provide their music to the show office by **12 noon Saturday, June 20th, 2026**
2. Music must be clearly labeled with the Rider's Name. It is the rider's responsibility to pick up their music from the show office prior to the close of the show.
3. Sound checks are available by request.



Awards:

Dressage Championship Awards:

Championship and Reserve Championship will be awarded for each division and category with **3or more qualifying competitors**. A final minimum average score of 60% must be obtained to be eligible for Championship. A final minimum average score of 58% must be obtained to be eligible for Reserve Championship. In divisions with less than 3 riders the Show Committee reserves the right to alter or combine the Championships and Reserve Championships presented. Freestyle scores do not count towards championship

Dressage Championship Criteria:

The **combined total of the top 2 tests at each level**, one of which must be the **most difficult test in the level**

Western Dressage Championship Criteria:

The combined total of the top 2 tests at each HCBC Western Dressage level, one of which must be the **most difficult test in the level**

Para Athletes

The combined total of any 2 tests in each level

Dressage High Point Award:

A Dressage High Point Award will be awarded to the dressage rider/horse combination who achieves the highest score of the show

Special Awards for Saturday Competition:

These awards will be announced at the Wine and Cheese Hour on Saturday Evening.

Class Lists

Please note that Riders may enter the same Test of Choice (TOC) class twice but must ride two different tests for prizes or be hors concours. On the Entry Form, please specify which tests you are riding.

Dressage Classes:

- Current EC Dressage Tests will be used
- Ribbons provided to 6th place
- The TOC class placings will be determined by highest percentage regardless of test number.

Western Dressage Classes:

- Junior & Senior divisions for First, Training and Walk/Jog tests
- Divisions are defined as per HCBC rules
- Ribbons provided to 6th place.
